



## **Mental Health Consultant**

Bradley Angle is a dynamic social service organization offering safe shelter and supportive services to survivors of domestic violence and their children since 1975. We offer an array of holistic programs and services focused on economic empowerment, housing assistance, LGBTQ+ programming, Healing Roots (a culturally-specific program for African American survivors), and Emergency Based Shelter Services.

Bradley Angle strives to have our staff and contractors reflect the diversity of our community, and we are committed to eliminating barriers to employment that many members of our community face. Bradley Angle does not discriminate against any applicant on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, gender expression, national origin, disability, political belief, marital status, age, sexual orientation, class, housing status, veteran status, physical size, or other legally protected status. ## **SCOPE OF WORK**

The contractor would provide mental health services to survivors of domestic violence across all programs. They will work with those referred by Bradley Angle with services including family psychotherapy with children/parents, individual psychotherapy, staff consultations, weekly supervision with MSW/BSW interns, and staff training. In this partnership, we anticipate serving survivors with a range of needs, with a goal of serving the most people possible and balancing the most meaningful intervention.

Contractor will collect demographic data for individuals served based on what is required of Bradley Angle through contracts, excluding information that would violate the rules and guidelines determined for providers of domestic and sexual assault services; the Violence Against Women Act Reauthorization 2015, as well as state and local guidelines. Contractor will not disseminate any information in an individually identifiable form without first obtaining the appropriate releases of information from the individuals served by Bradley Angle.



**REQUIREMENTS:**

- Master's degree or higher from an accredited school of social work, psychology or counseling.
- License to practice in the state of Oregon (PhD, PsyD, MD, LCSW, LPC, LMFT, PMHNP, etc.)
- Commitment to working with survivors of domestic and/or sexual violence and knowledge of violence, historical oppression and its effects on society.

**OTHER PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Two years of clinical experience preferred
- Demonstrated experience with diverse adults receiving mental health treatment
- Demonstrated expertise in evidence-based practice and trauma-informed care
- Respect for patient confidentiality
- Understand the historic and current racism and oppression distinctly experienced by the African American and LGBTQ+ Communities.
